

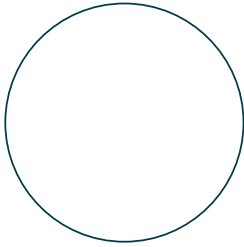

SAFETY GUIDELINES

- 1. Have a well-equipped first aid kit.**
- 2. Wear protective gloves, sturdy footwear and brightly colored clothing.**
- 3. Stay hydrated and be aware of any heat advisories. Notify an adult immediately if you feel unwell.**
- 4. Listen to weather reports and leave if your safety is threatened.**
- 5. Never enter private property, wade into water or walk on unstable ground.**
- 6. Be aware of potentially dangerous plants and animals.**
- 7. Handle all equipment and trash with care. Do not throw, toss, or play with equipment or trash.**
- 8. Don't pick up dangerous items such as biohazards and sharp objects. Notify an adult and wait for assistance.**
- 9. Stay in groups. Notify an adult if you feel concerned about your personal safety.**
- 10. Do not cross roads and be aware of moving vehicles.**

BUDGET

Can the project objectives be achieved with the budget?

Are measures in place to control and reduce unnecessary costs?

Is the budget sustainable for the project's duration and after?

Is the budget aligned with the DEIJ goals?

Are the impacts of this project measurable?

Are these impacts important for the community?

How will you measure the impacts?
